


Meet Ember, the FireSmart fox.


Ember teaches people how to keep their homes and neighbourhoods safe from wildfires. In this book, Ember visits people's homes to show them her favourite FireSmart tips. The tips in this colouring book show you how to remove fuel from your property as well as other materials that easily burn. This helps stop wildfire from finding a path to your front door. You can use the tips with your family to help keep your home safe! You will also find Ember inspired drawings from Indigenous artists, which have been included to celebrate the important role Indigenous Peoples have played in fire stewardship and acknowledge the unceded lands we occupy.





This artwork was created by Paul Windsor, a Haisla Nation/Heiltsuk Nation artist from Kitamaat Village and Bella Bella in British Columbia.






FireSmart Tip: Keep grass shorter than 10 centimetres.









FireSmart Tip: Remove branches that hang over the roof.





FireSmart Tip: Plant fire-resistant vegetation.

FireSmart Tip: Use fire resistant building materials.


