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#### Direct to Board from Planning and Community Development Committee, January 11, 2018

**Recommendation No. 3** Provincial Referral 2411961 for a Community Institutional use (Scouts Properties)

The Planning and Community Development Committee recommended that the report titled Provincial Referral 2411961 for a Community Institutional use (Scouts Properties) – Electoral Area A be received;

AND THAT the following comments be forwarded to the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development:

a. Subject to the following conditions, SCRD has no objections to the community institutional use on Mixal Lake, Provincial File 2411961:

i. Mixal Lake is not zoned. The existing institutional use reflects the upland public assembly use.

ii. SCRD will require a building permit and/or a development variance permit if any structures are constructed to access the moorage facilities.

iii. Water quality should not be impacted by maintenance or construction activities, materials or fuel storage.

iv. The proponent should implement both Provincial and *shíshálh* Nation's Best Management Practices for building and maintaining moorage facilities and in particular the most stringent of any overlapping policy to protect the foreshore ecosystems.

v. The old dock and construction materials shall be disposed of in accordance with all provincial and SCRD regulations at the time.

vi. Public access to the lake foreshore should be maintained.

AND THAT the staff report be forwarded to the January 2018 Egmont/Pender Harbour Advisory Planning Commission for consideration and recommendations received from the Advisory Planning Commission be forwarded to the Province as late information;

AND FURTHER THAT this recommendation be forwarded to the Regular Board meeting of January 11, 2018.
