Supply and installation of approximately 4 m of 150 mm diam. DI watermain, 13 m of insulated 250mm diam. Schedule 40 Stainless Steel (SS) or lined and coated Carbon Steel (CS) watermain, and 7 m of non-insulated 250 diam. Schedule 40 SS or CS watermain adjacent to the existing Sans Souci Road Bridge structure. The work will include but is not limited to: tie-ins to existing waterlines on Sans Souci Road, installation of pipe supports, thrust blocks, valves, removal and replacement of the existing Sans Souci bridge metal beam guard rail with a new metal beam guard rail including new metal beam guard rail bridge rail support posts, barrier brackets and bolts, and all water main appurtenances required for the installation complete. Work will also include the removal and disposal the decommissioned waterline located inside the sub structure of the existing vehicular bridge. 1.0 Introduction

1.1 These Instructions apply to and govern the preparation of tenders for this *Contract*. The *Contract* is generally for the following work:

- Supply and install approximately 24 linear meters of watermain, consisting of approximately 4 meters of 150 mm diameter DI watermain and 20 meters of 250 mm diameter Schedule 40 Stainless Steel OR lined and coated carbon steel watermain.
- Supply and install watermain thrust restraints, pipe supports, fence collar barrier, two resilient wedge gate valves, Air Relief Vacuum valve, pipe insulation, pipe elbows, appurtenances, and connection to existing watermain on each end of the vehicular bridge.

2.0 Tender Documents

- 2.1 The tender documents which a tenderer should review to prepare a tender consist of all of the *Contract Documents* listed in Schedule 1 entitled "Schedule of Contract Documents". Schedule 1 is attached to the Agreement which is included as part of the tender package. The *Contract Documents* include the drawings listed in Schedule 2 to the Agreement, entitled "List of *Contract Drawings*".
- 2.2 A portion of the Contract Documents are included by reference. Copies of these documents have not been included with the tender package. These documents are the Instructions to Tenderers Part II, General Conditions, Specifications and Standard Detail Drawings. They are those contained in the publication entitled "Master Municipal Construction Documents General Conditions, Specifications and Standard Detail Drawings". Refer to Schedule 1 to the Agreement or, if not specified in Schedule 1, then the applicable edition shall be the most recent edition as of the date of the Tender Closing Date. All sections of this publication are by reference included in the Contract Documents.
- 2.3 Any additional information made available to tenderers prior to the *Tender Closing Time* by the *Owner* or representative of the *Owner*, such as geotechnical reports or as-built plans, which is not expressly included in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 to the Agreement, is not included in the *Contract Documents*. Such additional information is made available only for the assistance of tenderers who must make their own judgment about its reliability, accuracy, completeness and relevance to the *Contract*, and neither the *Owner* nor any representative of the *Owner* gives any guarantee or representation that the additional information is reliable, accurate, complete or relevant.

4.0 Additional Instructions to Tenderers

4.1 **Project Schedule**

- Time is of the essence and Substantial Performance of the Work should be completed no later than June 30th, 2024, with the allowance of one (1) scheduled watermain shutdown.
- The Owner intends on awarding this Contract by October 31, 2023.

4.2 Optional Pre-Tender Site Meeting

An optional Pre-Tender Site meeting is scheduled for **10:00 AM** on **August 29th**, **2023**. The meeting will commence at the project site https://maps.app.goo.gl/VKMTG75iWPsjRXDZ6

Bidders will need to RSVP to <u>purchasign@scrd.ca</u> by August x, 2023, if no RSVP's are received the site visit may be cancelled.

4.3 **Public Notification**

The Contractor shall be responsible for public relations including, but not limited to: written notices to residents where and when detours and/or access restrictions are occurring. The Contractor's forces shall personally advise residents (48 hours in advance) in writing, pre-approved by the SCRD of any disruption to access or and other service inconveniences. Costs incurred by the Contractor will be incidental to the Contract.

4.4 Water Supply Disruption Notice

4.4.1 Contractor to provide minimum of 48 hours written notification to affected consumers of impending water service interruption. Affected consumers to be identified in conjunction with the Owner. Contract Administrator and SCRD will approve text.

No services shall be interrupted for more than 8 hours in any one day. If necessary, then temporary service must be provided.

- 4.4.2 Contractor to provide minimum 48 hours' notice to Emergency Services of any water system shutdown, or inactivation of hydrants.
- 4.4.3 Contractor to arrange with the Owner for the operation of any water main valve. Only Owner officials permitted to operate existing system appurtenances. The Owner will operate valves and inspect cuts, caps and tie-ins to all existing watermains following Contractor testing, disinfection, flushing and approval by the Owner once the Contract Administrator has supplied the Owner with all relevant testing, disinfection and flushing reports.
- 4.4.4 Contractor to provide at least 48 hours' notice to the Owner prior to tie-in work. Contractor to supply all materials, excavation, bedding, backfilling, compaction, gravel, pumps, approved lighting for night work and traffic control required to making tie-ins to existing mains.

4.5 **Archeological Monitoring**

- 4.5.1 Permitting and First Nation Consultation —Consultation with the Shíshálh Nation and Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) is necessary to facilitate fieldwork. Work within Shíshálh Nation and Skwxwú7mesh Traditional Territory requires a Shíshálh Nation or Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Heritage Inspection Permit and a minimum 30-day notice prior to commencement. As part of consultation, In Situ will facilitate the Shíshálh Nation and/or Squamish Nation's participation in fieldwork, as needed.
- 4.5.2 Monitoring An archaeological crew will be on site to monitor all ground-disturbing works until such time that the potential for encountering archaeological materials is eliminated. The standard crew complement will consist of one archaeologist and one archaeological technician. Additional crew may be added as needed to accommodate the workplan and archaeological observations, or if multiple

project components require excavation at once. The area in purple below does not require archeological inspection due to previous inspections completed.

4.5.3 <u>Trenching</u> – The excavator operator must communicate fully with the archaeologist on site prior to and during any excavation activities to ensure that a plan is in place and is understood by all parties. Where cultural (archaeological) materials are encountered, excavation will be limited to 10 cm lifts or at the discretion of the Field Director. The archaeologist will direct the relocation of material for screening. Where non-archaeological sediments are encountered (e.g., pavement, construction fill, culturally sterile clays, sand, or till), excavation may proceed at a pace suitable to the contractor.

Trench excavation will be monitored and, where suspected cultural materials are encountered, the archaeologist will direct the excavator operator to pause until the nature of the sediments can be confirmed as *disturbed*, *intact*, or *non-archaeological*. Once identified, excavation may proceed according to the procedures below. Non-archaeological sediment should be kept separate from the cultural sediment stockpile(s) during excavation. Once sediments are stockpiled, the archaeologist will facilitate the continuation of the trenching. Sample screening will be conducted separately from monitoring. Non-archaeological sediments may be directly loaded into a truck and removed from the site.

- 4.5.4 **Treatment of Disturbed Archaeological Materials** Sediments identified by the archaeologist as *disturbed* archaeological material may be excavated in 10 cm lifts and set aside for sample screening. A 25% sample of this material will be screened.
- 4.5.5 Treatment of Intact Archaeological Materials - Where intact deposits are identified; the archaeologist will direct the excavator operator in removing sediment along the trench to expose the top of the intact layer and determine the extent of the intact deposit. It is expected that 1 evaluative will be conducted per 5 m³ of intact archaeological deposits. The archaeologist will decide when/where evaluative units will be placed in consultation with Shishalh Nation and Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw. Trenching or other work may continue elsewhere while the evaluative unit is excavated (typically 8-12 hours of hand excavation). The archaeologist will determine where the sediments can continue to be excavated and stockpiled. Once the evaluative unit is complete, the mechanical excavation can continue at that location.

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An evaluative unit typically measures 1 m x 1 m square, and is hand excavated until the termination of archaeological deposits is reached, or to the depth required by the development, whichever comes first. Intact archaeological sediments will be 100% screened for discretionary artifact collection.

4.6 Other Information

- 4.6.1 Stainless Steel Victaulic groove fittings and alternatives are not acceptable as an alternate to field welding unless and otherwise prior written approval have been received by the Regional District's Engineer.

 Contractor to minimize the number of field welds required. For any field welding, the Contractor to submit a welding procedure that identifies how the welds will be undertaken to not introduce any contamination.
- 4.6.2 Medium to High traffic flows are to be expected during summer and fall. If material laydown area is too small and tight you may have to work with the neighbors to arrange for a convenient place.
- 4.6.3 Wall that is located next to the house with the speed bump sign is to be protected during the construction as shown on drawings.
- 4.6.4 Existing pipe to be abandoned in place with capped from both sides with at least 0.5 cubic meters of concrete at each end.
- 4.6.5 Environmental requirements as per Fisheries and Oceans Canada please do not allow debris, materials, etc. to fall into the water and there may be some first nations involvement.
- 4.6.6 All travelling lane surfaces must be restored to the existing condition or better to meet the MMCD standards. MOTI standards would not apply for this section as this section is privately owned.
- 4.6.7 Due to the bend, the Contractor will have to work with the existing road and conditions to install the new watermain. Contractor to pre-locate all utilities prior to construction. Given location is not exact and provided location is for reference only.
- 4.6.8 Currently the infrastructure is underground and not exposed to the elements (except where it comes out by the bridge), existing condition of the existing watermain / bends are unknown the Regional District believes it to be in good shape but if it needs to be addressed site instructions will be provided.
- 4.6.9 For restraints and tie-ins:

- 2009
- a. The Regional District will be doing the installation
- b. The Contractor will be supplying the materials for the Regional District to install. The Contractor will also provide equipment and operators to assist the Regional District during the tie-ins.
- **c.** A week notice is needed to schedule the Regional District Works crew to come to site for tie-in installation.
- 4.6.10 This is a unit price contract and there will be a member of the Regional Districts team and/or the Engineer on site to verify quantities. Quantity variations will be addressed as per the MMCD General Conditions.
- 4.6.11 Watermain span is 10.3 m as shown on the IFC Drawings. However, the pipe could be extended up to 13 m if required.
- 4.6.12 Road Closure:

Road can be closed for the tie-ins, if it's needed to be closed (for excavations or other reasons) Contractor will have to work with the homeowners. Traffic flow must be restored at the end of each day. No pen excavations are to be left overnight

- 4.6.13 Home Owner Notifications; Contractor will draft the notices for Regional District approval, and Contractor will issue it to affected home owners
- 4.14 There are no available records on the bridge structure, it is wood and concrete, Contractor should avoid interference to the bridge structure and foundations as much as possible.




